We seek candidates with a demonstrated record of internationally excellent scholarly research and excellent teaching in undergraduate and/or postgraduate courses in psychology. The position requires the candidate to be in this position for a significant number of years by the date of appointment.

- Teaching experience in a variety of core and specialised psychology courses, at both undergraduate and post-graduate levels.
- Experience with applying for competitive research grants.
- Experience with supervising undergraduate and postgraduate students.
- Evidence of excellence in teaching delivery.
- Excellent communication skills.
- The ability to work in a team with colleagues across a variety of social science disciplines.
