Courses as Instructor of Record

Introductory Surveys

COR2614: Publics and Privates on the Pacific Rim (Singapore Management University)

A cultures course focusing on how the concepts of 'publics' and 'privates' are operationalized in the making of the ideological geography of the 'Pacific Rim' and its discontents.

COR3001: Big Questions: Global and Local (Singapore Management University)

A core curriculum lecture course on the ecologies of locality and home in a global economy.

COR2615: Finding Home in a Globalized World (Singapore Management University)

A cultures course focusing on how 'global' flows relate to the production of 'home' as spaces.

COR3001: Big Questions: Happiness and Suffering (Singapore Management University)

A core curriculum lecture course on philosophical, psychoanalytical, and postsecular approaches to the theme of happiness and suffering.

ASIAN AM 214/HIST 214: Introduction to Asian American Studies (Northwestern University)

An introductory lecture survey on Asian American history, co-listed with the History Department. My course surveys the history of the Americas in relation to Asia and explicates the thesis from historian Gary Okihiro that 'Asians did not come to America; America went to Asia.'

ASIAN AM 225: Contemporary Issues in Asian America (Northwestern University)

An introductory lecture survey on contemporary issues in Asian America, including orientalizing racism, suburbanization, refugees, activism, radical politics, ideologies of liberalism and conservatism, Asian-black and Asian-Latinx relations, and settler colonialism.

ASIAN AM 220: Studies in Diaspora: The Chinese American Experience (Northwestern University)

An introductory lecture survey on Chinese American studies, using literary and sociological methods to explore the cultures, institutional structures, everyday lives, and trans-Pacific fields of Chinese Americans.

ASIAN AM 220: Asian American Social Movements (Northwestern University)

An introductory lecture survey on the origins of Asian America in the 1960s social movement known as the Third World Liberation Front. I use Paulo Freire's *Pedagogy of the Oppressed* to evaluate the Asian American Movement in comparison with contemporary social movements, including neoconservative ones.

JSIS C 214: American Religion (University of Washington)

An introductory lecture survey on pluralism, migration, race, and indigeneity in the United States. Topics include American Christianities (including evangelicalism), liberation movements within religious communities, and the question of 'Asian religions' in the pluralization of American religion.

Intermediate Lecture-Discussions

ASIAN AM 350/REL 369: Asian American Religion (Northwestern University)

An intermediate course, cross-listed with the Department of Religious Studies, on popular orientalist discourses in America in relation to the everyday practices of religion in Asian American communities.

ASIAN AM 370: Global Chinatowns (Northwestern University)

An intermediate course in urban studies focusing on spaces called 'Chinatown' both around the world and as sites of global connectivity, and in contrast to 'towns in modern China.'

GEOG 420: Cultural Geography (Simon Fraser University)

An intermediate course involving on the discipline of cultural geographies, covering topics such as cultural studies, racialization, capital and consumption, concepts of home, ecology, and religion and postsecularism.

Advanced Seminars/Directed Studies**ASIAN AM 303: Asian American Geographies (Northwestern University)**

A seminar interrogating the concept of 'Asian America' as the possible description of a space. In addition to reading Edward Said's *Orientalism* in its entirety, I also assign texts on trans-Pacific studies, labor geographies, suburbanization, refugees, and activism.

ASIAN AM 399: Independent Study in Asian American Studies (Northwestern University)

Directed studies reading courses, taught ten unique times. Topics have included: Asian American Christianity, Marx's *Capital* in Asian American studies, Korean dance and 'the invention of tradition,' sonic orientalism in popular movie soundtracks, Global China and feminism, research methods in Chicago's Chinese churches and trans-Pacific theologies, indigeneity and orientalism on the Pacific, the postsecular Pacific, and psychoanalysis and the Pacific.

JSIS C 490C: Trans-Pacific Christianities: Asian America and American Religion
